



Giving up work due to ill-health

Introduction

This scheme applies to public servants who are paying PRSI at Class B, C or D and who have to give up work because of ill-health.

Contributions paid or credited at these classes provide for Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Contributory Pension.

Credited contributions

If you are unlikely to return to work, you should send annual medical certificates to the Department of Social Protection. You may be given a credited contribution ('credits') for each week that you are sick. These 'credits' will keep your social insurance record up to date and may help protect your future entitlement to the above payments.

How do I apply?

To apply for 'credits', you should complete the application form **CR35**, and send it with a medical certificate, showing the date that you became incapable of work, to:

Sending in medical certificates

You should send your first medical certificate with the **CR35** application form. Your doctor should date this certificate **from** the date of retirement due to ill-health to the 31 December of the current year.

You must also send in subsequent annual medical certificates on 1 January each year for as long as you are incapable of work or until you reach age 66.

Your doctor should make sure your medical certificates state that you cannot work due to illness.

Health services

You may get services (such as a medical card) from the Health Service Executive in your area for yourself and your dependents.
